In the 16th century, after the fall of the Vijayanagara Empire, theMughlssold the city to Chikidevaraja Wodeyar, the then Maharaja of Mysore. The city's administration passed on to the hands of King Haider Ali when he seized control over the Kingdom of Mysore. An old fort in Bangalore. Nevertheless, after the victory in the Fourth Anglo-Mysore War, the city was captured by the British East India Company, and the administrative control was returned to the Maharaja of Mysore. The old city developed under the rule of the Maharaja of Mysore and was eventually made the capital of the Princely State of Mysore. However, the British shifted their cantonment outside the old city and soon developed a town around it that began to be governed as a part of British India. After the Independence of India in 1947, the city of Bangalore became the capital of the Mysore State. In 1949, the city and cantonment were unified into a single urban center. Bangalore became the capital of the State of Karnataka after its formation in 1956. "Bengaluru" the city's original name in the Kannada language was declared as the city's official name in 2006.
